6 Public Hearing: Proposed Amendment to Lease Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation

Minutes:

Mrs. Freeman opened the Public Hearing at 7:02 p.m. in connection with the proposed construction projects. The notice of this lease hearing was published as legally required on June 13, 2020 in the Greenfield Daily Reporter. Before a school corporation may enter into a lease agreement with a nonprofit building corporation, the school corporation must conduct a hearing regarding the execution of the proposed lease and whether the rental to be paid to the lessor building corporation under the proposed lease is a fair and reasonable rental for the proposed improvement. She turned the hearing over to Mr. Elkins to discuss the need for the projects. Mr. Elkins recapped the scope of the projects as originally presented April 13 and 20, 2020. Project 1: \$16,052,850 is for mechanical, electrical, plumbing, HVAC and roofing improvements district-wide. That amount was determined after a feasibility study was completed in the fall of 2019 and a list of improvements needed were identified and prioritized. The project, because of the dollar amount, is considered a controlled project. work has to stay under that controlled amount and subject to a petition remonstrance. No opposition was voiced and are a month past the time to do so. Project 2: Up to \$5,350,950 is not a controllect project and subject to board approval and legally capped at that amount. It consists of additional square footage and renovations that will address art, choir, band and cafeteria areas at Mt. Vernon Middle School. Though two separate projects, they will be financed by the sale of bonds with one issuance. A few weeks ago current debt was re-financed and doing so will save the corporation \$7 million. It is not anticipated that the debt service tax levy will increase over the 2019 rate of \$1.1202. Mr. Elkins will start working on which approach is best to get debt up and going. He will ask for approval to sell traditional bonds along with a bond anticipation note, which is short term debt, to cover expenses for a 10-12 month period.

There were no comments/questions. The hearing was closed.

10.7 Resolution 2020-17 Authorizing the Sale of Real Estate to the Town of Fortville Mr. Greg Elkins, Chief Financial Officer

Minutes:

Mr. Elkins stated the Town of Fortville has been working on a pedestrian safety project which includes a pedestrian walk-way from the town to Mt. Vernon Schools. .45 acres of corporation property located at the high school is needed for this project.
