FOOD2SCHOOL PURCHASING COOPERATIVE APPROVALS FOR 2023-2024

BACKGROUND: Northwest Allen County Schools serves as Lead District with the authority to administer procurement activities on behalf of the Food2School Purchasing Cooperative.

- Food2School member districts voted unanimously to renew all existing Contracts for GPO/Distributor, Milk and Bread for the 2023-2024 school year.
- Combined projected sales volume for the 2023-2024 school year is \$40,508,000.
- The goal of the Food2School Purchasing Cooperative is to obtain substantial savings by leveraging buying power on cafeteria food, supplies and services.
- The Food2School Purchasing Cooperative has grown from 55 districts in 2018-2019 to 99 Indiana school districts now serving the nutritional needs of 216,354 students.
- Northwest Allen County Schools Board of Trustees approved renewing existing contracts at their Board meeting on February 27, 2023.

RECOMMENDATION/FUTURE DIRECTION: Approve Contract Renewals for the 2023-2024 school year.

March 8, 2023 Food 2 School Renewal Price Adjustment Request 2023

Good Afternoon Leeanne,

As we have discussed over the past several weeks, renewing the current contract without a pricing adjustment and mode of adjustment during the contract would be extremely difficult for us based on several factors. The market in general continues to be extremely volatile and fluid as several key conditions in the geopolitical world threaten commodity pricing.

The first concern that we continue to have is the continuing war in Ukraine. The reality of a Spring Russian offensive has pushed the flour pricing up over the first six or so weeks of the New Year when we began talks for a renewal. Any significant acts of aggression can pressure the pricing of flour and other components to levels seen last February when the invasion began. At that time, the cost of flour increased 40% from sustained record highs in a matter of weeks. We currently continue to pay the same price for flour as we did much of last year due to the war, but also due to some national issues.

In December, the federal government intervened to prevent a national railroad strike. While this was definitively needed, it has also raised the cost of getting flour to each of our production facilities. As a large producer of bakery products, we use upwards of 5 million pounds of flour per week, primarily transported to our silos via railcar. We have received adjustments on pricing per hundredweight (CWT) once since the government intervention and do expect additional significant increases as we move through the calendar year. As China has ended many Covid restrictions, the international oil demand has dramatically increased while supply continues to be extremely limited. We do anticipate a continued increase to similar costing for diesel fuel across our entire fleet for the calendar year. While regular fuel did decrease dramatically from the second half of last year, diesel fuel saw very little downward movement.

Finally, as flour pricing has remained elevated, we are also now facing upward pressure on nearly all secondary bowl ingredients (all ingredients outside of flour used in production). Sugar, Cream Yeast, Salt, and Enzymes (shelf stabilizers and conditioners) have all increased on our breads, while eggs and butters have compounded pricing on our sweet goods side. All these factors make it impossible for us to renew our contract without addressing pricing. While we can continue to operate under the current pricing structures currently in place, we look to adjust pricing for the new school year as outlined on the attachment. We would further need an addendum added to the contract as an escalator clause for future protection due to the extreme volatility we have seen across component costs for the last 24 months.

Escalator Clause

"It is understood that, with unexpected market emergencies, pricing for a twelve-month period may not be realistic. In the event of an uncustomary increase in the market price of any item or items covered by the contract, Alpha Baking will have the flexibility for price adjustments when substantiated by independent third-party market commodity bulletins over a thirty-day (30) period in advance of the request, and when the resulting price change would be 5% or greater."

As evidence of the continued cost pressures across our industry, I have included the current Federally Released PPI Chart for Commercial Bakery.

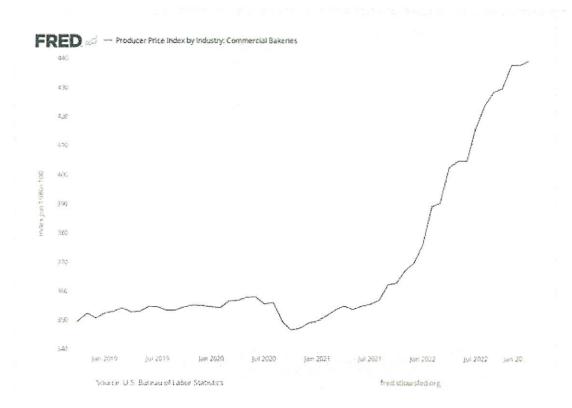
