Student Payment Schedule

WHY: To provide Peer Buddies an opportunity to use the skills they have learned in the classroom in a real-world environment. Students will use their skills to help make a wish come true for critically ill children. They will grow their leadership, communication, cooperation, and empathy skills.

MEDICAL RELEASES/PARENT PERMISSION ON FILE: All students will have a medical release and permission slip on file to attend the trip.

SAFETY AND SUPERVISION PROVISIONS: Students will be with an adult chaperone at all times in every location except their hotel room. Student to chaperone ratio is at max 1:4. Safety checks at each hotel room will occur each evening and morning to ensure all students are where they are supposed to be. Rooms will also be taped. Staff chaperones will be "on-call" throughout the night in the event of a student emergency. Students will also be provided with shirts each day of their trip so that chaperones can recognize them easily in a crowd.

Why Give Kids the World?

Give Kids The World Village is an 89-acre, whimsical nonprofit resort in Central Florida that provides critically ill children and their families from around the world with magical week-long wish vacations at no cost.

More than 30,000 children in the U.S. are diagnosed with a critical illness each year, and half of those who are eligible for a wish choose to visit Orlando. *Give Kids The World* is the nonprofit that fulfills all of these wishes. From life's simple pleasures to the stuff that dreams are made of, every wish family is treated to an all-inclusive experience including transportation, accommodations, all meals and snacks, nightly entertainment, donated theme park tickets, daily gifts, and nonstop fun at the Village, a storybook destination all its own – featuring an array of

accessible rides and attractions.



Twelve children from the Fortville area have been granted wishes to *Give Kids the World* including one of our very own MV graduates! Over 78 children from the two surrounding zip codes have also had stays at GKTW.

Students in our Peer Buddies program spend a semester building

relationships and creating an environment for our students in Essential Skills to feel included. They ensure our students in essential skills have the opportunities to join their peers at lunch and in the GenEd setting. At the end of the semester, many of our peers cry and beg to take the class again because of the impact the students have on them. Taking our students to GKTW will allow them to use the skills they have learned in class to make a Wish come true for critically ill children.

BENEFITS FOR MVMS STUDENTS

In this program, students will have the opportunity to acquire and enhance valuable skills in the following areas:

1. Communication: Students will develop effective communication skills, allowing them to express themselves clearly and confidently in various settings.

2. Leadership: Through engaging activities and projects, students will cultivate leadership abilities, empowering them to guide and inspire others.

3. Collaboration: Students will learn the importance of teamwork and collaboration, honing their ability to work harmoniously with diverse groups of individuals.

In addition, this experience will foster personal growth, empathy, community-mindedness, self-confidence, and the establishment of an inclusive environment where all students can thrive and build self-esteem.
